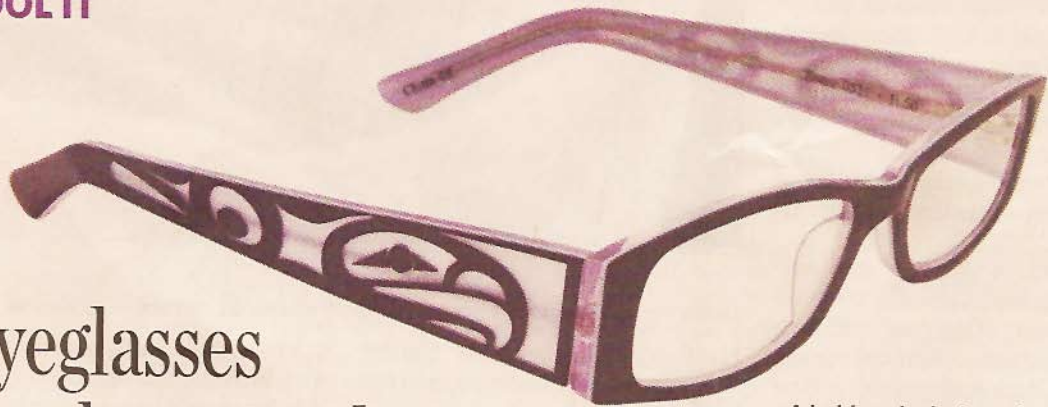

# Eyeglasses for the animal in you

If you think you're seeing eagles, ravens, hummingbirds and wolves — you could be.

Claudia Alan Inc., the British Columbia-based creator of ready-to-wear reading glasses and sunglasses, has contracted First Nations artist Corrine Hunt to design the cool, new frames for the company.

Hunt's artwork includes tradi-

motifs etched boldly and graphically onto the arms of the AYA Accessories glasses.

There are four styles of reading glasses (two specifically designed for women, two unisex) and the sunglasses come in three styles — two for women and one for men.

The reading glasses sell for between \$39 and \$60 and the sun-

glasses sell for \$35. As well, \$2 from the sale of every pair of the glasses is donated in support ONEXONE First Nations Nutritious School Breakfast Program.
